# Climbing & Falling

Exhibiting for the first time together, 'Climbing and Falling' is a symbol of the ups and downs explored in both the personal and universal narratives between the work of Amber Hearn and Kevina-Jo Smith.

Amber and Kevina-Jo are close friends and business partners, and recently created a supportive shared studio space, a reflection of how well they work together and their mutual commitment to their individual practices. They connected a few years ago over shared art and life ideas.

Amber is fascinated by memory, often drawing upon her childhood growing up in Papua New Guinea and regional New South Wales, she explores place and meaning held within the landscape. Amber now resides in the Blue mountains.

In her broad and woven gestural layering of gentle, yet built up colour, she draws on the notion that memory is recreated each time it is re-lived, and she presents this in her work visually, noting the layers of history and experiences held in landscapes she has inhabited.

"In my paintings presented in 'Climbing and Falling' I'm working directly with ideas surrounding water, flooding, mountains and my immersion within the landscape around my home in the Blue Mountains. I am responding to the last few years of environmental impact of the floods and heavy rainfall that has taken place here, as well as the many ups and downs within my internal sphere. 'Rain mountains/ Rain scapes' have been emerging, with the rain holding itself as a veil/shield that also works as a visual framing system for the built up dreamy/memory based, mountainous ranges."

Kevina-Jo Smith resides in the Blue Mountains, a place which sustains and inspires her. After many years of travelling, she chose to anchor herself here. Smith collects and reuses consumer by-product materials from which her artwork emerges. Each piece is intricate, and time consuming to create: a heavy practical span of hand-knitting, knotting and weaving. Her process is a tribute to the natural world and a ritual against destruction.

Kevina's current investigation also involves responding to her recent personal changes and challenges as well as the collective environmental changes faced in the mountains and the renewal that has taken place both personally and collectively. Whether it be through a large wall hanging, a framed woven piece, or a constructed item of furniture, she is weaving the stories of her space and memory through the work whilst utilising found and recycled materials as a statement of her ideas of how we can move forward as a community, caring for our land.

"These works are both typical of my previous work, but also entirely new and ordered. They are full of symbolism, meant only for myself and those who are meant to see into it. My artwork is a reflective way of meditating and processing, passing on any insight to others who might need it too".

Aesthetically, their work is complimentary in the space with a similar pastel palette, utilising blues as a tool to link in with themes of water/rain/veils/ memories. They both weave ideas visually through layers of colour. Combined their work has a strong story to tell, creating an immersive space that the viewer can weave themselves through.











## Milk Rain Veil






## Lilac Rain Mirror

## Sun Veil Mirror






## Sun Veil Hill








## Falling Lilac Sun Mountain












